Proposed Syllabus for Entry Test (English Section) for Recruitment of BPS-17
and Above at the Bahauddin Zakariya University

General Instructions:

- 1) The test will comprise of Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs).
- 2) Level of language proficiency: IELTS General
- 3) Test will comprise of two sections:
 - a) Reading Comprehension
 - b) Grammar & Vocabulary
- 4) Section-I will comprise of 60% marks out of the (total allocated to English) while Section-II will carry 40% weightage.

Instructions for Each Section:

Section-I: Reading Comprehension

This section will consist of two reading extracts of approximately 700-1000 words each. At the end of each extract Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs) will be given to check the reading comprehension. Potential areas for testing comprehension may include the following:


- 1) Information
- 2) Main idea
- 3) Opinion
- 4) Inferences (information which is not given directly)
- 5) Distinguishing facts from opinions
- 6) Writer's intent

Section-II: Grammar & Vocabulary

This section will test the candidate's command and competence of the basic grammatical structure and vocabulary. The questions will test the candidate's competence of grammar in areas including, but not limited to:

- 1) Subject verb agreement
- 2) Tenses
- 3) Parts of Speech
- 4) Transitive/Intransitive verbs

Potential areas for testing of vocabulary can include synonyms, antonyms and word meanings.
